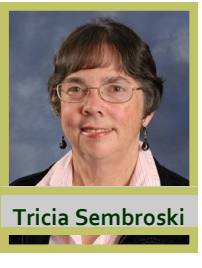


Liaison for Personnel.

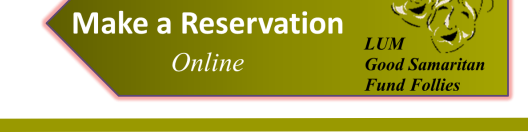
