



Update: Year In Review

LUM's Impact in 2013



In 2013, the number of households positively impacted by LUM programs and services increased once again. The Adult Programs at LUM served 6,027 households in 2013. The individual LUM Adult Program numbers for last year are as follows:

- Good Samaritan Program: 2,502 client visits
- Asset Building Class: 12 participants
- Case Management: 315 new clients
- St. John's/LUM Food Pantry: 8,344 client visits
- ID Clinic: 164 clients
- Emergency Shelter: 11,576 bed-nights
- Emergency Shelter: 636 new guests
- Income Tax Assistance Program: 1,548 clients
- Community Thanksgiving Celebration: 800 meals

LUM programs targeting students and children are limited to maintain the highest quality and limited by facility size, all of the programs maintained high numbers in 2013. The total number of children directly served in 2013 by LUM programs was 1,996. The individual LUM Children's Program numbers last year were as follows:

- After School Program: 66 new students participated
- Jubilee Christmas: 1,759 children were served
- LUM Camp: 80 campers attended
- Achieve! Stay-In-School Program: 36 students participated
- 5th Quarter Summer Learning Program: 55 new students participated

Lastly the Good Samaritan Fund in 2013 distributed \$117,300.97 to families with emergency needs — which is a 10% increase from 2012.

Thanks to each LUM donor, volunteer and staff member who helped LUM respond to these important needs in our community for children and families.

Volunteer Live-in Coordinator supervises shelter guests, and directs and oversees the work of shelter volunteers.
