The Board of Immigration Appeals has designated LUM as a recognized organization; and the Executive Office of Immigration Review has deemed specific LUM staff as accredited representatives in immigration review. LUM Immigration Clinic will now have accredited representatives who may assist individuals in immigration proceedings.

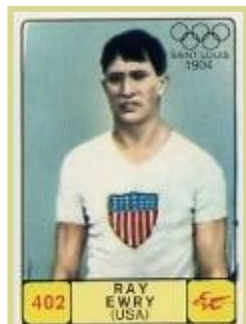
IHCDA Awards LUM Shelter \$44,000 Grant

Indiana Housing & Community Development Authority has recently awarded the LUM Emergency Shelter an *Emergency Solutions Grant* in the amount of \$44,026. ESG provides funding to LUM for essential services, operations and homeless prevention activities.



IHCDA recognizes that the LUM provides basic needs of shelter, food, and other necessities, and also provides case management, referrals, rental assistance and other services to individuals and families who are in need of assistance. The IHCDA grant award to LUM is the third highest announced for the entire state of Indiana. LUM is grateful to IHCDA for the funding; and to Joyce Fasani, LUM shelter director, for her work applying for funding and ensuring LUM stays in compliance with awarded grants.

Myth: Letting in More Temporary Visa Holders and Legalizing Current Illegal Immigrants Will Increase the Unemployment Rate.



Response: Immigrants Make Americans More Productive and Do Not Increase the Unemployment Rate.
In a 2009 article titled *Answering the Critics of Comprehensive Immigration Reform*, Stuart Anderson, an adjunct professor at the CATO institute (the same organization founded by Charles Koch) reported that "additional low-skilled immigration would not increase the unemployment rates of low-skilled U.S. workers."

The report went on to say that "With increases in low-skilled immigration, the U.S. economy would expand, creating more jobs in higher-skilled areas."
