The LUM <u>Turkey Trot 5K Run</u> is an annual event on Thanksgiving morning that gives runners & walkers a chance to participate in a fun community event while supporting and investing in the community through

This year, due to COVID-19, Turkey Trot will be a virtual 5K run/walk/



ride with a livestream allowing participants to track their steps and miles, receive inspirational messages and post updates on social media. It also featured remarks from local dignitaries Mayors Tony Roswarski & John Dennis, Council members Lisa Dullum & Kathy Parker. Hunger Hike cochairs, Purdue Coaches Sharon Versyp

and **David Kucik**, and their teams made an appearance. The Livestream also offered entertainment from **One Size Fits All** comedy improv group and magician, Scott Starkey, the **Wizard of the Wabash**.

Everyone missed the energy and excitement of gathering at Riehle Plaza surrounded by other passionate participants, but the desire to make a difference this year seemed even more urgent. Despite the challenges of COVID-19, <u>Hunger Hike</u> **2020** was a tremendous success.

Impact of LUM During a Crisis—3rd Quarter Numbers

Each year, while celebrating the success of the <u>Hunger Hike</u> event, the LUM staff is busily planning for the numerous fall & winter programs. Due to COVID-19, the LUM staff members began months ago re-imagining and re-inventing <u>Jubilee Christmas</u>, <u>Port of Hope</u>, the <u>Community Thanksgiving Feast</u> and the <u>Turkey Trot 5K Run</u>.

Fall is a good time to reflect on the tremendous positive impact that LUM has had on individuals, families, and children in our community. So far this year, 2,189 different individuals and low-



income households have been served by LUM. Lafayette Urban Ministry has nurtured and educated children, sheltered families, fed the hungry, supported the legal immigrant, and helped our neighbors experiencing homelessness become more self-sufficient — all through the faithful work carried on every day and night by LUM.

Thanks to your friendship and generous support, LUM continues to make our community a better place for all of its citizens. Please remember LUM through the remainder of 2020 by participating in one of our upcoming events, volunteering, or by giving a financial gift! Here is a better snapshot of LUM's impact in 2020 to date:

- 1,227 Good Samaritan Program visits for housing, utility and health-care requests
- \$136,026 Amount of <u>Good Samaritan Fund</u> assistance disbursed
- **1,453** Visits to the <u>LUM Protein</u> Food Pantry
- 147 <u>Immigration Clinic</u> cases
- 153 ID Clinic cases

- **5,842** Overnight stays at the Emergency Shelter
- 555 Overnight stays at the Winter Warming Station
- 344 Emergency Shelter number of individuals served
- 29 Emergency Shelter guests provided housing through the LUM New Opportunity Fund
- 239 Households provided free Tax Assistance
- 156 Total Children served: <u>LUM Camp</u> (40), <u>After School Program</u> (71), and <u>5th Quarter Summer</u> <u>Learning Program</u> (45)
- Jubilee Christmas: {TBD} Families and {TBD} children served (In 2019: 648 families & 1,765 children were served)
- Community Thanksgiving Celebration: {TBD} meals served (In 2019: 900 meals were served)

Three years ago, LUM welcomed the first family into one of the four houses purchased by LUM as a part of the newly created Isaiah 32 Project.

In the mid-2010s, LUM was encouraged by financial experts to invest funds held in the reserve account. After several months of research, the LUM board decided to invest conservatively and in something that would advance the LUM mission — and the Isaiah 32 Project was born. The goal is to be "good landlords" of well-maintained homes in good neighborhoods at affordable rates. With the help of Buzz Grady, LUM board member and public housing expert, LUM decided to become a part of the Housing Choice Voucher Program — a federal program permitting private landlords to offer public housing.

After only three years the benefits have been tremendous. This project provides excellent housing and also connects:



- The LUM Executive Director with the needs in our community
- The Maintenance Director with opportunities to teach parents how to maintain a clean and safe home, be a great neighbor and connect with the community
- The Business Office Staff with opportunities to teach fiscal responsibility & family budgeting.

The LUM Isaiah 32 Project is flourishing and is a blessing to our families, our staff and our community.
