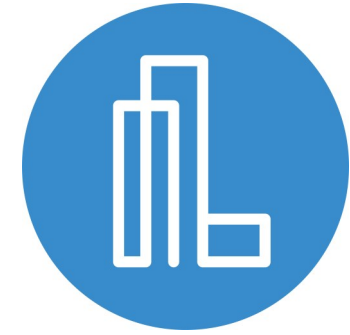
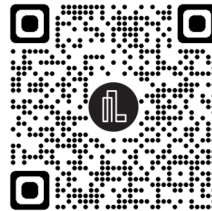

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM



WHAT'S OFFERED

- ◆ Emergency financial assistance
- ◆ Referrals to other assistance programs
- ◆ NO funds for doctor bills, car repairs, gasoline for cars, bus tokens, court or legal fees, bills not yet past due, bills too large

WHO MAY GET FUNDS

- ◆ Tippecanoe County residents ONLY
- ◆ Income: up to 150% of federal poverty level

HOW TO GET FUNDS

- ◆ Check-in hours:
Days/Hours: Monday through Friday at 8:15 a.m.
Place: LUM Office, 420 N 4th Street, Lafayette, IN
- ◆ Prescriptions – must be ready for pick-up at your pharmacy

WHAT YOU SHOULD BRING

- ◆ Picture ID
- ◆ Names & birth-dates of all adults & children in your household
- ◆ Required paperwork



What's Offered – Specific Needs & What to Bring



Utilities – Gas, Electric, Water

If you have received a disconnect notice, or if you need help with a re-connect fee or a deposit, the LUM Financial Assistance Program may be able to help.

What to bring:

- Current Disconnect notice
- Your Current Bill from the Utility company

GED Test Fee

What to bring: Proof of current enrollment and testing date

Work-related clothing

If you are starting a new job that requires a uniform, the LUM Financial Assistance Program may be able to help.

What to bring: Note from your new employer or the employment agency – listing required clothes or uniform.

Clothing – general

LUM has clothing vouchers from time to time which will be distributed to those in need.

Rent/Mortgage

If you need help paying your rent or a deposit, the LUM Financial Assistance Program may be able to help.

What to bring:

- Copy of your Current Lease or Bank Payment Book
- Rent Receipt or a Letter from your Landlord

Medical

If you need help paying for your prescription medication, the LUM Good Samaritan Program may be able to help.

What to bring:

- For Prescription medication, bring your Pharmacy Name & phone number
- HIP (Healthy Indiana Plan) – current bill
- Physical/TB Test – Note from your new employer or the employment agency – listing Physical Exam or TB Test is required

What's NOT Funded

The LUM Financial Assistance Program is NOT able to provide assistance for the following:

- Doctor bills
- Car repairs
- Gas for vehicles
- Bus tokens
- Court or legal fees
- Bills that are not yet past due
- Bills that are too large
